If there are no Karen applicants, the award could be granted to students from another refugee community); the award is for up to four years, with the requirement that the above conditions are maintained, and the student maintains a minimum CGPA of 2.00 or greater; the student can enroll in any KPU program (including Qualifying Studies in the ACA Faculty).
