1. Call to Order

4.1. President's Report to Senate

The President presented his report. He highlighted the upcoming Teaching and Learning event, encouraging participation.

4.1.1. Vision 2023

Alan Davis introduced the Vision 2023 committee, and presented an updated report. He outlined the consultations currently underway and planned. He introduced the vision architecture, a restated mission, values, and vision statement. He shared the next steps to be undertaken.

4.1.2. Revision to Mission, Vision and Values of KPU

Alan Davis provided background and context for Senate approving the changes encompassed in Vision 2023.

Sal Ferreras moved that Senate approve the Vision 2023 process to review the Mission, Vision and Values of KPU for recommendation to the Board of Governors.

Sal Ferreras updated the Senate on the development of the Faculty of Graduate Studies, and encouraged Senate to continue discussing the feasibility of a Faculty of Graduate Studies.

In review of the budget documents, the committee discussed the impact of international revenues, providing specialized services to support international students, quality and inclusiveness being exclusive metrics, and curtailing applications of international students to focus on the capacity to help students succeed.

The committee continued to discuss the need to identify the capacity of KPU overall to support students, declining provincial funding, costs associated with deliverables of a polytechnic university, establishing a process that encourages candid discussions about the budget, and defining the appropriate mix of international and domestic students.

David Burns moved that Senate forward the budget endorsement memo to the Board of Governors.
