Like many long-term, successful undertakings, Kwantlen University College had humble beginnings in 1970, opening in an old office building in New Westminster as part of Douglas College. Kwantlen later moved into a series of portable trailers in Surrey to begin offering a variety of different programs, and in 1981, officially separated from Douglas College to become its own institution. Then, as now, it was people that provided the energy and vitality that contributed to our growth and success.

In 1995, Kwantlen received degree-granting status and a new name – Kwantlen University College – and, over 25 years, grew to include four modern, high-tech campuses with state-of-the-art labs and high-tech studios, educating approximately 17,000 students in more than 135 programs each year.

And we aren't slowing down, with \$78-million in expansion projects currently underway, including the new Cloverdale Trades and Technology Centre, and new bachelor's and master's degrees under development.

In only 25 years, Kwantlen University College has evolved and grown from a local community college into a prominent educational institution serving the South Fraser region. We serve some of Canada's most culturally diverse and fastest growing communities. Our mission, to create an exceptional learning environment, prepares our students and community members for leadership, service and success.

After the convocation address, only the graduands will rise for general presentation. Following the presentation, they will resume their seats. The graduands will then be called and presented for the awarding of degrees, associate degrees, diplomas, certificates and citations.

It is suggested that the audience refrain from applause until the awards have been made to each class.

Convocation will conclude with the recession of the platform party, faculty and graduates, during which everyone is requested to remain standing.

Academic Regalia

Not until they slip into their regalia, do many graduates realize the significance of their convocation ceremony. For family and friends, the first glimpse of the graduate in cap and gown heralds a milestone in the life of their loved one.

At Kwantlen University College, all graduates wear the blue gown, while the blue cap and tassel distinguish graduates of our Bachelor's degree programs as does the black sash, or hood. The colour on each hood identifies a specific area of study.
