Program Employment Analysis

The Vice-President, Student Services reviewed the Program Employment Analysis and advised that graduates from the career and vocational programs were surveyed and it was found that 93.22% of the Newton Campus graduates are employed and 91.4% of the Richmond Campus graduates are employed.
