The show is designed to show the directions the various artists have taken since leaving Kwantlen to pursue either an art career or further art studies.

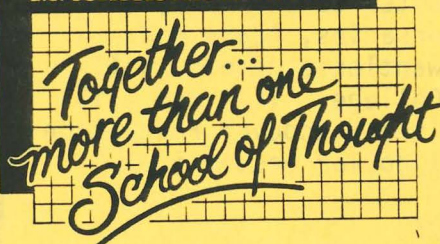

NEW GOVERNMENT STUDENT FUNDING PROGRAMS

The Ministry of Education announced two major Student Funding programs on July 26. A new scholarship program will provide up to \$400 for students at the mid point of two-year programs at Kwantlen College. As well, a B.C. Student Loan remission program will provide up to 33 per cent remission on all B.C. Student Loans.

We do not know at this time if the scholarship program is retroactive to study completed so far this year but the remission

Kwantlen's Public Information Office is involved in a joint campaign, sponsored by InformEd, the B.C. FOUR FOR ONE PROGRAM UNVEILED AT REGISTRATION

Students registering for the fall semester at Kwantlen in August will have an opportunity to help their fellow students by contributing to the Student Fund.

Each dollar contributed to the Fund, which will be used for bursaries, loans and scholarships for Kwantlen students, will be matched by the College. That sum will then be matched by the Vancouver Foundation, making the original dollar become four dollars.
