Presentation Academic Directors The Vice-President, Education introduced Messrs. Elmes and Finnbogason, Academic Directors on the Surrey Campus.

By use of an overhead projector, the Directors presented statistics on the general performance of Kwantlen transfer students at B.C. universities and an analysis of shifts in university transfer enrolments during the past six years (reports distributed to Board).

Presentation (cont'd)

Following a question and answer period, the Chairman thanked Messrs. Elmes and Finnbogason for the presentation.

Dumais Heritage House

The Vice-President. Administration informed the Board that the Langley Heritage Society has advised that the requested Federal funding for the restoration of the 'Dumais House' has now been approved. The Society is in the process of re-submitting an expanded budget to the Provincial Heritage Trust Fund for consideration early in April.

Mr. Milne reported on a conversation with Mr. Gordon Yusko of the Langley Heritage Society during which it was suggested that the Board send a letter to the City requesting that the designation proceed to a second reading. He explained that this request would indicate the Board's support and perhaps assist in receiving Provincial funding. In response to concerns about designation, he explained that the designation would not proceed to third reading without College consent.

Moved by Mr. Milne and seconded by Mr. Waenink:

THAT a letter be forwarded to the City of Langley requesting that the City proceed with designation of the Dumais House to the second reading and instructing them to withhold the third reading until the College is satisfied that all conditions of the designation are acceptable.

Fund Raising

The A/President advised that the College has raised \$43,186 towards the second year target of \$50,000 for matching funds from the Vancouver Foundation.

Moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mrs. Montgomery:

THAT the College supplement the fund raising account with \$6.814 to increase the account balance to \$50.000 and thereby enable the College to deposit \$50,000 with the Vancouver Foundation before March 31, 1987.
