### Letter from the Chairman of the Board

TO KWANTLEN EMPLOYEES

It seems appropriate for me to write an open letter to the College administrators, faculty and staff as Kwantlen commences its life in the British Columbia college scene.

As many of you know from your experience in the birth of Douglas this is a special opportunity for us and exciting times lie ahead. The College will only be what we make it, (with help of course from my friends in Victoria) and all the "parts" of the College have a clear responsibility to make the maximum cooperative effort to ensure the public are well served by Kwantlen.

The opening months will be an extra challenge for us as we will be competing for Tony Wilkinson's time with his responsibilities at Ryerson. This situation has, perhaps, magnified concerns of some faculty who see the organizational structure, approved by our predecessor Board on the advice of the president, as not being to their liking. As you know, Douglas spent a great deal of time and energy on the question of organizational structure over the past few years and the Board decided to go with a model that emphasizes the community in "community college" and one that will be flexible to allow for the tremendous growth we will experience in the decade ahead. We recognize that some concerns still exist, however, we believe that when the organization and the functions of the Educational Advisory Council are fully comprehended and implemented they will provide the support and coordination needed for a highly complex and dynamic community college.

I know that Board Members are dedicated to contributing their share of effort, understanding and commitment, and with your cooperation, we will ensure that Kwantlen College develops as a vibrant, responsive and worthwhile educational institution.
