

The Coat of Arms Kwantlen University College

The Governor General of Canada, the Rt. Hon. Romeo LeBlanc, presented the official coat of arms to Kwantlen University College on May 4, 1999. The coat of arms was unveiled at a special ceremony to mark the historic occasion for Kwantlen.

Working closely with Robert Watt, the Chief Herald of Canada, a team from Kwantlen created the coat of arms to symbolize both the past and a vision for the future. Artist Brandon Gabriel of the Kwantlen First Nation designed the shield. It features a wolf, representing teacher and guide, a salmon for beginnings and a man and a woman representing community spirit.

Arts

2 year diploma, 1 year certificate F/T, P/T, semester start Langley, Richmond, Surrey

Degree, diploma or certificate: University transferable courses are offered in Anthropology, Applied Communication (some courses transferable to other universities), Creative Writing, Criminology, Economics, English, Fine Arts, French, Geography, Geology, German, History, Humanities, Japanese, Mandarin, Music, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology and Spanish.

Requirements to enter first year English courses: English 12—B or equivalent. Prerequisites for other courses may vary.

2 year Associate degree F/T, P/T, semester start Langley, Richmond, Surrey

Preparation for third year university studies towards a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Anthropology, Geography, Music, Psychology or Sociology. The Associate of Arts degree — General is for students who have not selected a major area of study. These 2 year programs meet some of the requirements of a Bachelor degree at Kwantlen. Requirements to enter first year English courses: English 12—B or equivalent. Other prerequisites vary with program.

Criminology

2 year diploma, 1 year certificate F/T, P/T, semester start Langley, Richmond, Surrey

Preparation for a major in Criminology, Criminal Justice, Law, Social Work, Social and Behavioral Sciences and employment in all areas of the justice system.

Fine Arts*

2 year diploma, 1 year certificate F/T, P/T, semester start Surrey

Students acquire a solid foundation in the basic skills of visual arts. Courses are transferable to Fine Arts degree programs at BC universities and the Emily Carr Institute of Art & Design.

Music*

Associate degree or 2 year diploma, 1 year certificate F/T, P/T, September start Langley

The certificate builds a foundation in music: music history theory, aural musicianship, rhythm skills and performance. The diploma provides advanced training and university transfer options in general or comprehensive studies or performance (orchestral instrument; guitar; piano; vocal). Entrance requirements: audition/interview; music theory exam for diploma applicants. Piano majors: Grade 10 RCMT or equivalent. Other instruments or voice: Grade 6 RCMT or equivalent. If music is your life, let Kwantlen's Music department be your choice. Call (604) 599-3315.

Social Sciences

Associate degree or 2 year diploma, 1 year certificate F/T, P/T, semester start Langley, Richmond, Surrey

Associate of Arts degrees (2 year) are offered in Anthropology, Geography, Psychology and Sociology. University transferable courses are offered in these disciplines and in Criminology, Economics, Humanities, Philosophy and Political Science. Requirements to enter first year English courses: English 12—B or equivalent. Other prerequisites vary with program.

University Studies/Science

Kwantlen University College now offers undergraduate degrees, in addition to a full complement of university studies. Kwantlen is subject to the same rigorous review of academic standards as other universities and university colleges in BC.

Applied Science (Engineering)

1 year certificate F/T, P/T, semester start Richmond, Surrey

Complete the first year Engineering, Science and Math courses at Kwantlen, then transfer to second year engineering at UBC (with a suitable GPA) or do course-by-course transfers to other engineering schools. Requirements to enter first year university-level courses: Chemistry 12–C+; Math 12–B or assessment through placement test; English 12–B or equivalent; Physics 12–C. Applicants lacking these courses or grades may join the program, but will have to take preparatory courses at Kwantlen as needed. Note: High school courses from the applied academic stream in the above subjects will be reviewed on a course-by-course basis. Associate of Science

2 year Associate degree F/T, P/T, semester start Richmond, Surrey

Gain an Associate of Science degree, then transfer elsewhere to third year of a Bachelor of Science degree. Transfer credit is available for all courses. Courses suit both the physical science and life science streams. For entrance requirements, see the Science section below.

Science

2 year Associate degree or 2 year diploma F/T, P/T, semester start Richmond, Surrey

Complete the 2 year program and gain an Associate of Science degree or diploma, then transfer elsewhere into third year of a Bachelor of Science degree. Transfer credit is available for all courses. Students may transfer at any time, but are encouraged to take their first two years at Kwantlen. Courses suit both the physical science and life science streams. Requirements to enter all first year university level courses: Chemistry 12–C+; English 12–B or equivalent; Math 12–B or assessment through placement test; Physics 12–C. Applicants lacking these courses or grades may join the program, but will have to take preparatory courses at Kwantlen as needed. Note: High school courses from the applied academic stream in the above subjects are reviewed on a course-by-course basis. Bachelor of Applied Design in Interior Design *

4 year degree F/T, September start Richmond

Prepares students wishing to pursue a design career related to the built environment. Program requirements: English testing (LPI Level 5); interview; questionnaire; portfolio review. See note. *

Bachelor of Applied Design in Fashion Design & Technology *

4 year degree 2 year diploma F/T, P/T, September start Richmond

Preparation for careers in fashion design including apparel design, industrial pattern making and sewing, computer-aided drafting and design, pattern grading and marker making, production planning, marketing and business. Diploma program requirements: English testing: Level 4 LPI or English12 –C+; portfolio presentation and interview. Degree requirements: a GPA of 2.7 and a minimum of 60 credits in the fashion design diploma from Kwantlen or an acceptable equivalent diploma. See note. *

Fashion Marketing Certificate*

1 year certificate F/T, P/T, semester start Richmond

Bachelor of Science in Nursing or Diploma in Nursing

4 year (8 semester) degree or 6 semester diploma F/T, September entry for Year 1 students FT/PT, September, January start for students continuing into degree completion Surrey

Preparation for a career as a registered nurse in a variety of public health and high technology environments. Program requirements: BC grade 12 or equivalent or mature student status; current First Aid certificate; CPR certificate—Level C; medical; immunizations; criminal record search; interview; references. Chemistry 11—C+; Biology 12—C+; English 12—C+; Math 11—C. For students continuing to degree completion, satisfactory progress through years 1 and 2 with a cumulative GPA of 65% and satisfactory progress in semester 5 is required.

Early Childhood Education

3 semester certificate F/T, September start Surrey

Prepares students to meet BC's licensing requirements for employment as an early childhood educator. Program requirements: English 12–C or English assessment; CAAT— see the Admissions office; First Aid certificate; 90 hours of successful volunteer or paid work experience with children; criminal record search; recommended immunization.

Early Childhood Education with English as an Additional Language

13 month certificate F/T, January start Surrey

Prepares students to meet BC's licensing requirements for employment as an early childhood educator. Program requirements: English language assessment; satisfactory health; experience in the care of young children; criminal record search; interview; orientation session; 2 letters of reference.

Early Childhood Education Post Basic

Varies, 1 year P/T, September, January start Surrey

Provides students with skills and knowledge in the care of infant/toddler and/or special needs children. Program requirements: Basic Early Childhood Education certificate, criminal record search.

Graduate Nurse Qualifying Course(s)

4 months P/T, October, February start Surrey

For nurses who graduated outside Canada who want to qualify for registration in BC. Qualifying courses in mental health, maternal child and pediatric nursing. Program requirements: letter from RNABC; TOEFL 550+; TSE 50+; CPR certificate - Level C; no active TB; interview.

Graduate Nurse Refresher

5 months - 1 year self-paced September, January start Surrey

Preparation for the refresher course requirement for registration in RNABC. Program requirements: registration with RNABC or eligible for registration in BC; English language assessment; CPR certificate—Level C; no active TB; interview.

Graduate Nurse Upgrading: English as an Additional Language

9 month certificate F/T, September start Surrey

For nurses from other countries to upgrade English and nursing skills as required by the RNABC. Program requirements: letter from RNABC; English language assessment; appropriate nursing experience; CPR certificate—Level C; no active TB; interview.

Human Service Worker

3 semester certificate F/T, P/T, September start Langley, Surrey

Provides the knowledge and skills to support individuals with mental disabilities (Community Support Worker). Program requirements: English 12—C or equivalent; 100 volunteer hours or employment in the field; references; medical assessment; First Aid; criminal record search; interview.

Resident Care Attendant

19 week citation F/T, last week August, January start Surrey

Prepare for work as a front-line care provider in continuing care facilities. Program requirements: grade 9 equivalent on standard reading test; medical assessment; no active TB; emergency First Aid certificate; CPR certificate—Level C; 2 letters of reference; criminal record search; interview.

Horticulture & Equine Studies

Commercial Floristry

8 month certificate F/T, September start Langley

Training in floral design and flower shop operations for employment with floriculture wholesalers, flower shops, design studios or floral departments in garden centres. Most theoretical and practical training is in a modern floristry lab with 18 work stations and a walk-in cooler. Students have work experience one day a week at a flower shop. Program requirements: English 11–C.

Equine Studies / EQUA

Certificate or citation; duration varies P/T, semester start Langley

Students specialize in Equine Facilities Management, General Health and Nutrition, Lameness and Injury, Reproduction, Breeding and Exercise Physiology. Credits can be applied toward a 30-credit certificate or 15-credit citation. Courses meet once a week for 15 weeks. EQUA is a fully accredited academic-based program of study. No training of horse and rider is involved.

Farrier Training

9 month certificate F/T, September, January, April start Langley

Preparation to shoe normal horses. Training in therapeutic shoeing and advanced gorging. Difficult cases may need referral to a senior farrier. Three blocks of 12 weeks. Program requirements: 2 years verified experience handling horses; demonstrated horse handling skills.

Horticulture Access / HRTA

Duration varies P/T, semester start Langley

Students specialize in Parks, Arboriculture, Retail Horticulture, Landscape Maintenance & Design, Greenhouse Production or Turfgrass Maintenance. Credits can be applied toward citations or a technology diploma. Designed for entry level positions in horticulture, job upgrading or special interest. Courses are from 5 to 15 weeks in length.

Horticulture Technician

10 month certificate F/T, P/T, September start Langley

Students specialize in Greenhouse Vegetable Production or Landscape Maintenance. Three 12-week terms for Greenhouse Vegetable Production or two 15-week terms for Landscape Maintenance. The four most common crops are covered: tomatoes, European cucumbers, bell peppers and lettuce. A highly practical, demanding program with over 800 hours of training in three 12-week terms; 500 hours of paid industry work experience. Program requirements: English 11—C or equivalent; Math 11—C or equivalent.

Horticulture Technology

2 year diploma

F/T, September start; P/T September, January start Langley

Build a solid foundation in horticulture including computer and management skills, crop production, mechanics and safety. Specializations: Landscape; Turf Management; Greenhouse and Nursery Production and General Horticulture Studies. Students can design program content through electives. All specializations require core courses and 490 hours summer work experience between semesters 2 & 3. Program requirements: English 12—C or equivalent; Math 11—C; Chemistry 11 or Physics 11—C required.

Landscape Maintenance Technician

11 month certificate F/T, P/T, September start Langley

A highly practical, demanding program to develop qualified technicians for commercial and residential landscape maintenance. Students learn Modern Landscape Maintenance practices; Turfgrass Maintenance; Integrated Pest Management; Weed Control; Plant Identification; Irrigation and Drainage Maintenance; Arboriculture; Estimating and Ergonomic Principles. 700 hours of training over two 15-week semesters and 14 weeks paid industry work experience. Program requirements: English 11–C or equivalent; Math 11–C or equivalent.

Practical Horticulture Apprenticeship

4 year journey person certificate
Four six-week technical training periods
Langley

Students can continue working while acquiring new skills and knowledge. A four-year apprenticeship with four six-week training periods of theoretical and practical instruction at the BC Horticulture Centre at Kwantlen. The first two years of instruction cover basic horticulture subjects: Safety; Botany; Soils; Pest Identification; Plant Identification; Nutrition and Business. Subjects in years 3 & 4 specialize in landscape or production. The curriculum for technical training was developed by industry and provides up-to-date information based on recent technological advances.

AutoCAD Mastery

3 months P/T, September, January, April start Newton

This program trains students in the use of the microcomputer, its operating system and AutoCAD. Basic and advanced courses available. Program requirements: 2 years drafting experience or permission of instructor.

AutoCAD Advanced Topics

36 hours per option P/T, continuous intake Newton

This program trains students in advanced AutoCAD use and specific application areas. Program requirements: 1 year minimum AutoCAD experience or AutoCAD Mastery or permission of instructor.

Computer Systems Technician

45 week certificate F/T, September start Newton

Practical training in the installation, servicing and upgrading of computer equipment and related systems. Program requirements: grade 10 Reading comprehension + vocabulary; grade 12 level of Math; Physics 12 or equivalent recommended.

Public Safety Communications

Prepares students to work in police, fire and emergency medical communication centres and related areas through practical, hands-on simulation in a realistic lab setting. 





Admission Requirements

General Information

This mini calendar is effective Sept. 1, 1999 to Aug. 31, 2000. The university college calendar contains complete program information.

- Anyone who has graduated from a BC secondary school or its equivalent can attend Kwantlen.
 If you are not a high school graduate, you may still attend.
- Our semesters begin in September, January and May.
- A program requirement is a specific course, assessment or other requirement for a student to get into a particular program.
- A prerequisite is a specific course required for entry to a program or a higher level course.

An applicant must be able to undertake studies in the English language and produce evidence of competence to do so. Where there is doubt, an applicant may be required to take a test of facility in the English language prior to admission to the university college.

Admission to the university college is made within the following categories:

Regular university college admission

Anyone who has graduated from a BC secondary school or the equivalent from another school system, is eligible to attend Kwantlen University College.

Mature student admission

Anyone who has not graduated from a BC secondary school, or the equivalent from another school system, and who will be 19 years of age, or older on his or her first day of attendance at Kwantlen, is eligible to attend Kwantlen.

Underage admission

Anyone who is not a graduate of a BC secondary school, or the equivalent from another school system, and who will be 17 years of age, or older on the first day of attendance at Kwantlen and who has not been in regular attendance at a secondary school for a minimum of one year, may be admitted to Kwantlen in order to enrol in Academic & Career Preparation.

Special admission

An applicant who does not meet any of the above admission criteria may appeal for admission as a special admission student to a specific program. The applicant may be required to attend an interview with an Assistant Registrar to present reasons for requesting special admission status and must provide supporting documentation as requested. An applicant admitted as a special admission student is admitted to a specific program and may not change without prior approval of an Assistant Registrar.

Admission to a program

Once an applicant has met one of the university college admission requirements, they may be considered for admission to a specific program. Each program has a different set of admission requirements. For some programs, such as University Studies, an applicant who has satisfied the general university college admission requirements also has satisfied the program admission requirement. For other programs, there may be several specific admission requirements in addition to the general university college entrance requirements. Upon acceptance, qualified applicants for a continuous intake program are placed on an applicant list in order by date of qualification. When a space becomes available, the applicant at the top of the applicant list is called and informed of the date he or she begins the program.

Testing

Testing is required for entrance into some programs. Testing helps determine your appropriate placement level as certain courses and programs have special prerequisites:

Mathematics Placement Test (MPT)
English Placement Test (EPT)
Second Language English Placement (SLEP)
Canadian Achievement Testing (CAT)
Language Proficiency Index (LPI)
