REGISTRATION UP-DATE

Preliminary enrolment figures indicate that Kwantlen College enrolled the equivalent of 2,991 full time students for the Spring Semester 1985. As in past years, this represents a decline from Fall 1984 when 3,235 full-time equivalent students were registered. However, Spring 1985 has 142 more full-time equivalent students than Spring 1984.
