6. New Business

6.1. AC 13 Minimum Qualifications: Faculty of Health, Health Unit Coordinator

Patrick Donahoe introduced the topic. Janice Webster from the Faculty of Health provided an overview and answered questions.

Change: Minimum of 5 years' experience as a Health Unit Clerk or nurse in an acute hospital setting to Minimum of 5 years' experience as a Health Unit Clerk or nurse in an acute **care** hospital setting

Patrick Donahoe moved THAT the Senate Governance Committee recommends Senate approve the Health Unit Coordinator (HUC) addition to the Faculty of Health AC13 Minimum Qualifications.

The motion carried.

6.2. Committee Mandate Revision: Senate Standing Committee on the Library

Patrick Donahoe introduced Chris Traynor, the Chair of the Senate Standing Committee on the Library. The committee discussed the revised mandate statement and-the role of the Senate Standing Committee on the University Library in advising the University Librarian on matters such as budgeting. The committee compared the role of the Faculty Councils advising Deans to the role of the Senate Standing Committee on the University Library advising the University Librarian. The mandate supports helping the University Librarian determine priorities for budget development and use of space and facilities. The SSCL Chair noted that revising the mandate of the committee was also intended to encourage more member engagement. Comparison of KPU SSCL's mandate with those of other universities' senate committees, and determining what the committee can effectively accomplish was part of the drafting exercise. SGC feedback indicated that the mandate could be more nuanced.

Action: the Senate Standing Committee on University Library will revise the mandate.

6.3. Committee Membership Revision: Senate Standing Committee on Program Review

David Burns provided context and background for the discussion. The committee discussed the role of the Deputy Provost as a voting member, and the designate of the Provost and Vice-President, Academic as a non-voting member.

David Burns moved that the Senate Governance Committee recommends Senate approve the revision to the membership composition of the Senate Standing Committee on Program Review.

7. Standing Items

7.1. Vision 2023

Alan Davis presented an updated Vision 2023. He and Ken Stark answered questions from the committee. The committee discussed the plan for future consultations, compiling information from all sources to identify a spectrum of topics, doing further analysis of the reputation comments received on Thoughtexchange, the meaning and development of reputation, and effective ways to reach out into the community.

Recommended Resolution:	THAT the Senate Governance Committee recommends that Senate approve the revisions to the mandate of the Senate Standing Committee on the Library.
Senate Standing Committee Report:	On November 15, 2017 the Senate Standing Committee on the Library (SSCL) endorsed revisions to its mandate and recommended endorsement by the Senate Governance Committee (SGC) for approval by Senate. After feedback from SGC at its January 8, 2018 meeting, minor revisions were made once again to the mandate, and approved by SSCL members via electronic vote in January 2018.
Context & Background:	At its September 27, 2017 meeting, the Senate Standing Committee on the Library (SSCL) struck a working group to review the committee mandate. SSCL felt the present mandate may not accurately reflect the work of SSCL and its vision. In performing its review, the SSCL working group compared the mandates of similar Senate Standing Committees on the Library at SFU, UBC, and UVIC.
	 SSCL felt the current mandate was rather static and did not encourage action. Revisions are designed to make the language more action-focused.
Key Messages:	 One additional bullet (2) was added with inspiration from other senate library committee mandates. In response to feedback from the Senate Governance Committee (January 2018), the wording has been adjusted so as not to imply any conflict with the existing University budget consultation process. The revisions were approved by SSCL via electronic vote, January 2018.
