STUDENTS BUILD FUTURE UNDER COLLEGE PROGRAM

A Kwantlen College graduate is the first apprentice carpenter selected for a new training scheme by B.C's non-union construction industry.

Graham Almond, 19, of White Rock, will spend 3.5 years indentured to the 350 member independent Contractors and Businesses Association of B.C. (ICBA)

Almond was hired on completion of Kwantlen's 8-10 month Carpentry/Building Construction program. Acceptance of only college or institute trained applicants is among several plan features meant to attract employers.

"We get calls from employers looking for trained people," said Kwantlen instructor Don Currie. Graham, a former pizza delivery man, is now working on a Surrey condominium project.




