

KWANTLEN BOARD APPOINTS ACTING PRESIDENT

The Kwantlen College Board announced today that Dr. Jack Newberry has been appointed as the Acting President of Kwantlen College. Dr. Newberry is the Executive Director of Management Services Division, Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and has been seconded by the Board. He will share his time between Victoria and his responsibilities at Kwantlen College until a new college president is appointed.

A well-known figure within post-secondary education, Dr. Newberry has been active in the development of the community college system since 1972. He will bring valuable assistance in commencing the planning stage of the new permanent campus announced by the Honourable Russell Fraser, Minister of Post-Secondary Education on June 25th.

While being introduced to the College staff, faculty and administration by David Penn, Chairman of the Board, on Tuesday, July 15, Dr. Newberry commented on "the need to re-examine what Kwantlen College is, what it is trying to do, and what direction it ought to take in the future." He stated that, "We face five major tasks over the next several months:

- 1. Self-study (now underway)
- 2. Review of college direction for the Five Year Educational Plan
- 3. Planning of the permanent campus
- 4. Search of a new president
- 5. Organizational review

He concluded by saying he was pleased to have a role in initiating the future of Kwantlen College and was looking forward to working with all of the College community.
