Simon Fraser University is again offering a variety of educational television programming on the Knowledge Network during Spring, 1986. A number of flyers giving dates, times and program outlines are enclosed, together with the comprehensive brochure which describes our KNOW programs, highlights of Summer, 1986, and general information on the University's part-time study programs.

Apiculture: An Introduction to Bees and Beekeeping, is a nine-part television series which provides the necessary information to begin beekeeping as well as useful material for those who have some knowledge of and an interest in bees. Registration details are outlined in the flyer.

The three-part series Beyond Turtle Graphics: Growing Up with Logo explores the computer language, gives examples of a variety of educational applications, and discusses the philosophy behind Logo.

Mass Communications in Canada is a series of ten television programs which explore the role of the mass media and other electronic communication technologies in Canada, the creation of media content, the interaction between content and audiences, the role and issues of media ownership and prospects for Canada in an information age. The series is in support of Communications 130: Explorations in Mass Communications, a new Distance Education course. The programs will also be of interest to high school and college students and instructors and the general viewing audience.
